


Gap between Marijuana and Cocaine Use Among Juveniles Arrested in Washington, D.C. Continues to Grow

Juvenile drug test results from the D. C. Pretrial Services Agency, show that since November 1991, cocaine positives among juvenile arrestees have stabilized at between 4% and 9%, while marijuana postives have continued on an upward trend. Thirty-three percent of juvenile arrestees tested positive for marijuana in October, 1992, the highest level ever.
