

Alcohol Use Increases Among University of Maryland College Students; Disapproval of Use Decreases

Alcohol use has increased among students at the University of Maryland College Park, according to the results of a 1998 student drug survey. In 1998, nearly three-quarters of students reported that they had used alcohol in the month prior to the survey, compared to 68% in 1991. This increase may be fueled, in part, by students' attitudes towards alcohol use. Disapproval of alcohol use decreased from 28% in 1991 to 18% in 1998 and disapproval of underaged drinking fell from 55% in 1991 to 40% in 1998. Similar relationships have been found for marijuana use among youth (see CESAR FAX, Volume 8, Issue 21).
