#### **PREFACE**

Since 1990, the Center for Substance Abuse Research (CESAR) has arranged for the Survey Research Center, University of Maryland College Park, to include questions on drug-related issues in its telephone poll of Maryland residents. The 2001 Maryland Household Opinion Poll was administered by the Survey Research Center between July 6 and August 12, 2001.

The first section of this report describes the survey methodology and the characteristics of the respondents to the survey. Section II presents highlights of the 2001 poll including general crime questions asked of all respondents. This section also includes responses from parents to questions about underage drinking. Section III compares results from the 2001 poll with similar polls conducted in 1990, 1992, 1994, Spring and Fall of 1995, Winter 1998, and Summer/Fall 1999. The appendices include the survey responses delineated by respondent demographic characteristics.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

The telephone survey was conducted for CESAR by the Survey Research Center at the University of Maryland College Park between July 6 and August 12, 2001.

1,840 adults ages 18 and older, who reside in Maryland households and own a telephone, were selected randomly.

A total of 1,005 (55%) adults completed the interview; 22% refused; 19% were not contacted; and 4% involved miscellaneous problems such as language barriers or hearing difficulties.

Results have been weighted to correct for differences in sample eligibility and to adjust the sample distribution to approximate that of the Maryland population (based on Census Bureau's March 2000 Current Population Survey) for the following demographic variables: sex, age, education, race, and state region.

The estimated margin of error for the survey results is  $\pm$  4% for questions asked of all respondents. Questions asked of the parents only (N=251) have a slightly higher error rate between  $\pm$  5-7%. Questions which were asked of even smaller groups (Figure 14a) have yet higher error rates.





Figure 1 – Are there any places in your neighborhood that you avoid after dark because of crime?





Do you think adults 21 and older should be able to possess small amounts of marijuana for their personal use without legal penalty?






Figure 4 – Are drugs being sold in the neighborhood where you live?




Figure 6 – Is Cocaine (including crack) being sold in the neighborhood where you live?



Figure 7 – Is Heroin being sold in the neighborhood where you live?










Figure 11 – Would you be most concerned if your child...



Do you think that the things you did or said before your child reached the age of 10 would greatly affect, somewhat affect, or not at all affect his or her decision to drink alcohol later in life?





Figure 13 – What percentage of 8<sup>th</sup> grade students in Maryland do you think drink alcohol on a regular basis?






Figure 14a – What did you do when you found out?






Figure 17 – Have you ever allowed your child to have one or more alcoholic drinks in your home?



Figure 19 – Are there any places in your neighborhood that you avoid after dark because of crime,1998-2001?





small amounts of marijuana for their personal use without legal penalty, 1995-2001?





Figure 22 – Are drugs being sold in the neighborhood where you live, 1994-2001?


